Town Christmas Light Fundraiser Dinner





"A KINGDOM FOR A STAGE"

Henry V
Performed by Henley In Arden School
At The The Mac, Birmingham, 11/5/2019
Appraised by Paul Jenkins

I would like to extend my most sincere congratulations to Henley In Arden School for their tremendous production of Henry V as part of the 2019 Shakespeare Schools Festival. It was an excellent night of theatre, and I'd like to highlight a few aspects that really stood out. Set in the world of a computer game, this was an ensemble piece that was filled with action, telling the tale of England's great King with a real sense of creativity. The cast was absolutely brilliant at taking direction - both from their teacher and from the theatre staff who guided them through their technical run. There are many professional companies that could learn a lot from this group!

I was very impressed with the way the cast used the framing of the computer game as a

narrative for the story - bringing a lightness to the narrative and giving it a context outside of the original play. The cast was never phased when altering between the two realities and this helped the audience understand exactly what was going on in the play. The contrast between the French and English armies was great to see, both in their use of accent and in the affected attitudes they displayed towards their English enemies. As we crossed back and forth over the channel the tension rose; particularly in Henry's rousing speeches and in the well-coordinated battle scenes performed by the whole cast. One of the strengths of this piece was the ensemble moments that built tension, for example during the battle of Agincourt there was a marvellous moment when the cast interwove the reality of the boy playing the computer game with the bloody and gory battle. It was a pivotal moment in the play and the shocked reaction of the whole cast was really

Overall, this was a brilliantly told story, from a committed and very talented cast. Thank you for sharing it with us!

Performing Shakespeare's words on a professional stage takes bravery, resilience, and creativity. You should be immensely proud of what you and your teachers have achieved in this Season of Infinite Variety.
