Although in many areas around the country we were unable to recognise our service personnel who had fought in the wars, Henley was able to celebrate with an open air Remembrance event in the Jubilee Gardens, at the back of the St Nicholas Church, last Sunday

It was a very humbling and unique experience, with Henley in Arden school students asked to lay a wreath and represent all of the students from all of the Henley schools.

Below is a photo of our Head Boy, Jack Rowley and Head Girl, Zoe Styler, with two of the flag bearers that were also present at the event.



Fittingly, it was very much a past and present occasion, with both of the two flag bearers being ex-students of Henley school, which they left in 1976.

On leaving, Alan Jackson, on the left, went to work with a local painter/decorator for a short time before joining the Royal Navy in 1977. Based at Chatham, Rosyth, Plymouth and Portsmouth, Alan spent 10 years in the Navy before leaving to pursue a career at Jaguar. He is now retired. Paul Merrell, on the right of the photo, grew up in Henley just a few doors away from Alan and they have remained lifelong friends. Paul left Henley School and joined the Army Cadets before becoming a Boy Soldier in the Army. During his three year sign up Paul became part of the spectacular White Helmet Motorbike Display Team, famous throughout the world for its daring, neverbefore-seen motorcycle acrobatics. Leaving the Army he became a HGV driver for Peugeot, before meeting up again, and working with Alan, at Jaguar. It was a pleasure to meet these two ex-students. Once again in developing our connections with the community, we as a school have been invited to participate in a sponsored "Lets Walk to Bethlehem", in conjunction with the Henley residents, including our Chair of Governors, Sue Westmacott. We have agreed to take part as it will support Henley in receiving funds for their switch on of the Christmas lights as well as supporting the national anti-bullying charity, in providing training of our students and others around the country. We are proposing

for our students in each form to walk 50 miles between them. Even in these challenging times, if you are in a position to do so, I hope you might be able to support this initiative.

I would also like to highlight our request for a parent to join our governing body. The Governing body representing Henley is fantastic and effective and they have a space in their group. I wonder if my name will ever appear in the paper, either as a war hero who saved thousands of lives or as one of the fallen? This will not happen to me, I am young, fit, and healthy. I will make a difference and end the terrible war. They will not hurt my country or family. I can stop them, and I will do my bit!

Kisses and hugs are exchanged, reassuring words fill my heart with love, as tears roll down my face. I step onto the train, I want to freeze time, so that the faces that I see will always remain. I put my bag under the seat and stand at the window. I see their faces disappear as the platform fades and the train smoke fills the air. I look around, I am not alone; we are brave but scared.

As I sit down on the train, feeling like my heart is about to burst, I hear a voice. A young man, about my age, takes the seat next to me and says hello, he has a friendly face and a cheery voice. We chatted for a couple of hours and I soon establish that we are both going to the same place.

I've never seen that friendly face again, along with so many others that came into, and out of my life during that time. I don't want to talk about what happened during my time away. The memories remain, even if the scars have faded. I will never forget the time that I left my home as a boy and returned as a man. Unlike many, I was lucky, I got to stretch back out in my bed and see my family photo on the bedside table once more.

18th October

The days are getting longer and harder. I'm hardly getting any sleep, and the little sleep I get is filled with nightmares of the guns and shells. When will the war stop?

All of us are being worked harder and harder. Every time I shoot and kill, I feel guilty and ashamed of myself. He tries to hide it, but I can see our Sergeant Major has had enough too. But we all know we have to persevere. What would happen if we didn't fight? We'd all be dead. So, we work our hardest all the time. But it's difficult.

Bang. Bang. Rifle fire after rifle fire. It just is far too much to handle.

Christmas Lights' Committee have been unable to hold any fund raising functions this year, we have decided to seek your help by holding a virtual sponsored walk.




We need 67* people to walk 50 miles, or groups/families as a joint venture to walk the same.
