
Twitter Wins!

The book is called Meditations by a Roman Emperor Marcus Aurelius BUT what has struck me about the philosophy is how timeless it is and that many of our forebears have experienced just what we have and what the next generation are experiencing. I find comfort in this pattern of human nature and also, hopefully, some solutions and inspirations that I will share here.

"You have power over your mind — not outside events. Realise this, and you will find strength."

I wonder if from this quote our young people could see that we have the power to control how we deal with challenges and trials? The strength is in us to decide how our mind perceives a challenge. It could be a test, assessment, friendship (or enemy-ship!) issue, a nasty rumour, a crucial match – but it is our mind that we can control in tackling the event – the event itself is beyond our control, but how we deal with it is within us.

"Everything we hear is an opinion, not a fact. Everything we see is a perspective, not the truth."

This quote seems particularly relevant in our social media age. Marcus did not have snapchat but we can see here that in many ways social media has given us megaphones, where perhaps we need mirrors. We are ever more concerned and cornered by information about what others think of us, and what we think of others but we should look to this quote to show us that these external views do not have to become our truths. Perhaps this would be a useful quote as we know that the young people in our lives have an ever greater online perspective which may not always be as truthful, helpful, positive or even as necessary as 'real' life.


Head of Year 11 Report






Olivia Taylor is back in school after competing in Fort William, Scotland at the British Downhill National Mountain Bike Competition recently.
