Blended Learning – Henley-in-Arden School 2023

Introduction:

Henley-in-Arden school reopened for all pupils in September 2020 following school closure due to the global pandemic. However, we are required to put plans in place in case of a local or national lockdown arrangement or a breakout of COVID-19 within the school community.

Blended Learning Policy Aims:

- To ensure that blended learning delivery meets the guidelines set by the awarding organisation.
- To ensure that assessment methodology is valid, reliable and does not disadvantage any group or individual learners.

In order to do this Henley-in-Arden school will:

- Ensure that teaching/delivery/assessment staff are timetabled to support blended learning when learners are working remotely
- Ensure there is a process to manage feedback on assignments, questions are constructively answered, and feedback is provided in a timely manner
- Ensure the setting of assignments is undertaken in the face-to-face sessions and that deadlines are clear
- Where remote teaching takes place, supervision is also given from teaching staff in the school or qualified cover teachers.
- Ensure that when learners submit work measures are taken to ensure the work is authentic and has been completed by the learner
- Maintain and store securely all assessment and internal verification records in accordance with our exam board centre agreements and JCQ guidelines.
